Dear Ms. Blair,

In March of 2016, I contacted you for an opinion regarding red light camera engineering plans in New York. I received a prompt reply, attached hereto. In addition, I e-mailed your offices, regarding a seal requirement for a professional engineer, and also received a prompt reply, attached hereto.

The purpose of the above is that I was retained on a 16 year old pedestrian auto fatality which occurred on May 5, 2015, on Miller Place Road and Route 25A, Miller Place, NY. Sadly, there was another 14 year old pedestrian auto fatality on February 24, 2017 at the same intersection. See attached Newsday articles. My expert P.E. requested that I obtain the certified engineering plans for this fatal intersection, including traffic signal and red light camera engineering plans, in order to form an opinion with a reasonable degree of engineering certainty on the cause of death.

Through FOIL and court order of non-parties to the fatal litigation, I obtained uncertified red light camera engineering plans, and uncertified traffic signal plans for the fatal collision intersection. I sought to ascertain why the plans for red light camera systems were unsigned and uncertified, and was advised by Nelson & Pope, P.E, that they were not retained to do certified red light camera engineering plans. Nelson & Pope's response to my subpoena is attached hereto. Also attached hereto, are Xerox State & Local Solutions, Inc., and Nelson & Pope red light camera engineering plans, and traffic signal plans.

Therefore, based upon the above, no certified engineering plans were requested from Nelson & Pope P.E., by Xerox State & Local Solutions, Inc., or Gilbert Anderson, P.E., Commissioner of the Suffolk County Dept. of Public Works, for the entire Suffolk County Red Light Camera Program. Attached hereto is project manual face sheet. There are no signed and sealed plans for either the traffic signal or red light camera engineering plans at the fatal intersection of Miller Place Road and Route 25A, Miller Place, N.Y. NYS DOT has confirmed there are no signed and sealed traffic system or red light camera engineering plans at the fatal location, in response to a FOIL request, attached hereto.

Under the Suffolk County red light camera program, Xerox State & Local Solutions, Inc., pays the following entities to fulfill the contract with Suffolk County for the Suffolk County Red Light Camera Program:

- a. The Engineers Nelson & Pope P.E.'s for traffic signal and red light camera engineering plans, for all red light cameras in Suffolk County.
- b. <u>Hinck Electric</u> For installation of the red light cameras at all locations in Suffolk County.
- c. NYS DOT Permit fees and maintenance fees, for each and every red light camera intersection in Suffolk County
- d. <u>Suffolk County</u> Share of the revenue from the red light camera engineering plans.

In consultation with my expert P.E., the following determination has been made of importance:

- 1. Gilbert Anderson, P.E., Suffolk County Commissioner of Dept. of Public Works, accepted on behalf of Suffolk County Red Light Camera Program, with Xerox State & Local Solutions, Inc., unsigned/unsealed and uncertified for-profit traffic control devices, (red light cameras), in the presence of uncertified traffic signals at the collision intersection. Upon information and belief, this has been done at every Suffolk County red light camera intersection from 2010 to present.
- 2. Nelson & Pope Professional Engineers produced unsigned/unsealed red light camera system plans for the fatal intersection with knowledge that they will be constructed on the public right-of-way for Xerox State & Local Solutions, Inc. Upon information and belief, this has been done at every red light camera intersection since 2010.

The above conclusions directly impact my expert P.E.'s opinion, with a reasonable degree of engineering certainty, on the cause of the aforementioned fatality on May 5, 2015.

Please advise whether or not Gilbert Anderson, P.E., and Nelson & Pope, P.E's, under the Suffolk County Red Light Camera Program, are operating in violation of New York State law, Article 145 Section 7201 and 7209, and whether or not any findings, actions or referrals will take place to protect the life, safety and welfare of the residents of Suffolk County.

The definition of practice of engineering is defined in Education Law, Article 145, section 7201. To assist licensees and the public in understanding the practice of engineering the Board has developed practice guidelines. Please find below an excerpt from practice guidelines No. 1 (available on our website at <a href="http://www.op.nysed.gov/prof/pels/peguide.htm">http://www.op.nysed.gov/prof/pels/peguide.htm</a>) that you may find helpful.

"The practice of engineering means any service or work, the performance of which requires engineering education, training, and experience in the application of engineering knowledge and data, and the application of special knowledge of the mathematical, physical, and engineering sciences to services such as:

#### Consultation

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- Investigation
- Evaluation
- Planning
- Design of engineering works and systems
- Engineering surveys
- Oversight for the purposes of determining if work is proceeding in compliance with drawings and specifications

The above listed items may embrace such services or work, either public or private, in connection with any utilities, structures, buildings, machines, equipment, processes, work systems, projects, and industrial or consumer products or equipment of a mechanical, electrical, hydraulic, pneumatic, chemical, or thermal nature, insofar as they involve safeguarding life, health, or property; and includes such other professional services as may be necessary to the planning, progress, and completion of any engineering services."

As traffic signal and red light camera installations involve traffic, structural, electrical and other types of engineering, this work would fall under Education Law, Article 145, section 7201 – Definition of practice of engineering.

Thank you for contacting the New York State Board for Engineering and Land Surveying.

The seal and signature of a professional engineer on a document has been interpreted as an attestation that, to the best of the licensee's belief and information, the work represented in the document:

- is accurate,

- conforms with governing codes applicable at the time of submission,
- conforms with reasonable standards of practice and with a view to the safeguarding of life, health, property and public welfare,
- is the responsibility of the licensee.

Section 7209 of the State Education Law requires every professional engineer have a seal and identifies when it must be applied. It does not specify whether it is to be an embossing seal, rubber stamp or electronic seal.

In all cases the licensee should ensure that the seal is legible, does not obscure the information contained in the seal and in accordance with Section 7209. Where a pressure sensitive or adhesive label is used, it is recommended that the signature should not be applied to the actual label, but rather to the document itself. In addition, you may want to contact the municipality responsible for approving the work to see if they have any specific requirements or restrictions.

If a corporate seal is placed on a document, it must be accompanied by the seal and signature of the professional engineer who is responsible for the work.

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

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# John Luke, 16, dies after being struck by vehicle in Miller Place

John Luke spent Tuesday evening with his high school history tutor at his Miller Place home, then told his family he was going for a stroll. He was walking home after hanging out with friends when he was fatally struck crossing the street, his family and police said.

"Everyone's distraught. They're besides themselves, they don't know whether they're coming or going," said Luke's aunt Mary Luke, who lived with the teen in Miller Place.

Suffolk police said Wednesday that Luke, 16, was probably crossing from the north side of Route 25A to the south side at Miller Place Road at 11:30 p.m., when Francesco Giulietti, traveling west, hit him with his 2015 Chevrolet sport utility vehicle.

Luke was taken to John T. Mather Memorial Hospital in Port Jefferson where he was pronounced dead. He was a junior at Miller Place High School, the district said.

Suffolk Det. Sgt. Michael Fitzharris said "it seems probable" Luke was crossing against traffic.

The driver, Giulietti, 35, of Farmingville was taken to St. Charles Hospital in Port Jefferson where he was treated for trauma and released. A police spokeswoman said Wednesday no charges are pending.

Miller Place Schools Superintendent Marianne Higuera said in a statement that district officials "extend our deepest condolences to the student's family and friends during this heartbreaking time."



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School officials made mental health teams, including grief counselors, available Wednesday at the school, she said.

Luke's family and friends remembered him as a quiet child coping with teenage growing pains -- finding love and growing facial hair.

At his home, not far from the high school, his friend Rachel Ruquet, 19, left a half-dozen roses near a side door.

"I just want his family to know that there are people thinking about the situation; he's not going to be forgotten or neglected at all," said Ruquet, a 2014 Miller Place High graduate.

Ruquet said she befriended Luke in her senior year when she saw him sitting alone in the lunchroom. Luke was quiet, "but when he smiles, that's when it all comes out," Ruquet said.

Although the district said he was a junior at the high school, his aunt said he was being tutored at home this year because he had been suspended. He had defended himself and a female friend against someone trying to bully them last year, said Mary Luke, 37.

"He was just a good kid that would do anything for anybody," his aunt said. "He would go the extra mile to defend them."

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# Teen pedestrian's death on Route 25A in Miller Place renews concern about safety of 5-lane highway

The death this month of a teenager who was struck and killed while crossing state Route 25A in Miller Place has renewed worries that the road remains dangerous, despite efforts to make it safer.

Residents and merchants said the five-lane highway in a busy commercial corridor has

seen a rash of crashes in recent years, even after New York State Department of Transportation officials added safety features such as manually operated pedestrian crossing signals.

Some residents said their worst fears were confirmed on May 5, when John Luke, 16, of Miller Place, was struck and killed while walking across Route 25A at Miller Place Road. The driver of the car that struck Luke was not charged. Police said Luke may have been crossing against traffic.

DOT spokeswoman Eileen Peters said additional improvements may be considered when Suffolk County police complete their investigation into Luke's death. A police spokesman said the investigation was ongoing.

Many residents blame traffic congestion and speeding drivers for accidents. The posted speed limit is 45 mph.

"Especially the summertime here — bad intersection," said Arshad Ali, the manager of a BP gas station near where Luke was killed. Ali said he has seen many dangerous encounters between drivers and pedestrians.

A driver "pays attention on the road, not to the pedestrians," he said.

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Suffolk police said in the first four months of this year there were 49 motor vehicle accidents — an average of nearly three per week — on Route 25A between Rocky Point-Yaphank Road in Rocky Point and Miller Place Road.

Formerly a two-lane road, Route 25A was expanded to five lanes about 25 years ago as the area's population grew. Some say increased traffic has led to more accidents.

"We don't want to urbanize the area, but we have to find things that work for both pedestrian and vehicular traffic," Miller Place resident Drew Martin said. "We're pretending to be in the country, but we're really not."

State DOT officials added new lane and center median markings after a 2013 study of the highway, which is used by 48,000 vehicles a day. State and community officials have discussed adding "traffic calming" measures such as raised center medians or pedestrian bridges to improve safety.

Brookhaven Town Councilwoman Jane Bonner said some residents expressed reservations about those plans.

"Nobody's driving the speed limit. If you're driving the speed limit, they're tailgating you," Bonner said. "The big question is, how do you correct bad driver behavior?"

Rob Fitton of Miller Place said more traffic lights might slow drivers.

"When you get on those long roads and there's no lights, people have a tendency to drive too fast," he said. "It's a very dangerous area."

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# Family mourns Miller Place teen Nicolo Signore who was struck, killed while riding bike

Friends and family gathered Saturday to mourn at the home of a Miller Place teen who died after he was struck by a sport utility vehicle while riding his bicycle.

The street outside 14-year-old Nicolo Signore's home was filled with cars as family members

gathered on the front porch. The family declined to speak with a reporter.

Signore was hit by an SUV just after 5 p.m. Friday as he attempted to ride across Miller Place Road at Route 25A, Suffolk police said.

The teen had been following his friends, who also were on bicycles, and was the last of the group to cross the street, witnesses told investigators.

But the traffic light turned green for northbound traffic to turn left onto Route 25A before Signore finished crossing the road, police said. As the driver of a 2015 Honda Pilot, Jessica Doyen, 52, also of Miller Place, attempted to turn left onto Route 25A, her SUV struck the teenager, according to police.

Doyen was not hurt and stayed at the scene, police said.

Miller Place Rescue took Signore to Stony Brook University Hospital, where he was pronounced dead, police said.

The vehicle was impounded for a safety check and the investigation is continuing, police said.

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As of Saturday, criminal charges against Doyen were not expected.

At the scene of the crash, about a mile away from Signore's home, a colorful bouquet of daisies tied to a utility pole marked the spot where the teen was struck.

A spokesperson for the Miller Place school district said grief counselors would be sent to the high school on Monday. The teen, who played lacrosse, was in ninth grade, she said.

Signore is the second teen hit and killed at the intersection in the last two years. John Luke, 16, of Miller Place, died of his injuries after he was hit while walking across Route 25A in May 2015. That death sparked renewed concerns about the safety of pedestrians on the state road.

The vehicle was impounded for a safety check and the investigation is continuing, police said.


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
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
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
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




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
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





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

# Important Information Concerning Seals for New Licenses

New York State Education Law<sup>1</sup> and the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education require that **architects, landscape architects, land surveyors** and **professional engineers** have a seal, approved by the board for each profession, for affixing to all drawings and specifications submitted to public officials. Below are the statute and regulations that establish the requirements for the manufacture of these seals. If you have questions, please contact the Office of the Professions at <a href="mailto:op4info@nysed.gov">op4info@nysed.gov</a> or 518-474-3817.

#### Architecture - Part 69.5 Seals

- For those applicants initially applying for licensure on or after the effective date of this part [January 1, 1987] seals used by licensed architects shall be circular in shape, 1¾ inches in diameter, bearing the legend at the top of the outer band "Registered Architect" and at the bottom "State of New York". In the inner circle above the Great Seal of New York shall be shown the name of the licensee, and below the Great Seal the license number with no other letters or numbers.
- To all plans, specifications and reports to which seal of an architect has been applied, there shall also be applied a stamp with appropriate wording warning that it is a violation of the law for any person, unless acting under the direction of a licensed architect, to alter an item in any way. If an item bearing the seal of an architect is altered, the altering architect shall affix to his item the seal and the notation "altered by" followed by his signature and the date of such alteration, and a specific description of the alteration.

### Landscape Architecture - Part 79-1.4 Seals

- For those applicants initially applying for licensure on or after the effective date of this part [January 1, 1987], seals used by licensed landscape architects shall be circular in shape, approximately 1¾ inches in diameter, bearing the legend at the top of the outer band, "Registered Landscape Architect" and at the bottom "State of New York." In the inner circle above the Great Seal of New York shall be shown the name of the licensee, and below the Great Seal the license number with no other letters or numbers.
- To all plans, specifications and reports to which the seal of a landscape architect has been applied, there shall also be applied a stamp with the appropriate wording warning that it is a violation of the law for any person, unless acting under the direction of a licensed landscape architect, to alter an item in any way. If an item bearing the seal of a landscape architect is altered, the altering landscape architect shall affix to his item the seal and the notation "altered by" followed by his signature and the date of such alteration, and a specific description of the alteration.

## Professional Engineering and Land Surveying - Part 68.10 Seals

For those applicants initially applying for licensure on or after July 1, 1984, seals used by licensed professional engineers and land surveyors shall be circular in shape, approximately 1¾ inches in diameter, bearing the legend at the top of the outer band, "STATE OF NEW YORK" and at the bottom "LICENSED PROFESSIONAL ENGINEER" or "LICENSED LAND SURVEYOR" or "LICENSED PROFESSIONAL ENGINEER AND LAND SURVEYOR" as the case may be. In the inner circle above the Great Seal of New York shall be shown the name of the licensee, and below the Great Seal the license number with no other letters or numbers.



To all plans, specifications, plats and reports to which the seal of a professional engineer or land surveyor has been applied, there shall also be applied a stamp with appropriate wording warning that it is a violation of this law for any person, unless he is acting under the direction of a licensed professional engineer or land surveyor, to alter an item in any way. If an item bearing the seal of an engineer or land surveyor is altered, the altering engineer or land surveyor shall affix to the item his seal and the notation "altered by" followed by his signature and the date of such alteration, and a specific description of the alteration.


